# 2. Important Notices

#### **Visa Application (MOST IMPORTANT)**

All student visas must be applied for at a Korean Embassy or Consulate in the student's country of residence before arriving in Korea. Our office will send all prospective students an Acceptance Package, which will include copies of all necessary documents for applying for a student visa. However, visa requirements may vary by country, so students are strongly advised to contact the Korean Embassy or Consulate in their area to confirm the specific requirements.

Exchange students **MUST** apply for and obtain a D-2-6 student visa **BEFORE** arriving in Korea. Students **SHOULD NOT** arrive in Korea on a tourist visa or under visa-free tourist conditions, as they will not be granted a student visa while in Korea. Please note that the student visa is a single-entry visa, valid for 90 days from the date of issuance. Once in Korea, students must apply for a Residence Card (RC), which serves as both an identification card and an entry/exit permit.

If a student enters Korea using a single-entry visa and leaves the country before receiving their Residence Card (RC), the visa will be automatically invalidated. This means the student will need to apply for a new Certificate of Admission and obtain a new visa, which can be time-consuming. Additionally, If student do not apply for foreign registration and subsequently leave the country, their D-2-6 visa will be invalidated, necessitating a new visa application.

## **Cumulative GPA Confirmation**

To consider and respect as much as our partners' diverse grading system and to meet the qualification of the Hanyang University exchange program, we would like to request a confirmation from the student's home university for the cumulative GPA. There will be a part on the nomination form to confirm that the student's cumulative GPA is over 60% based on home university grading system, and it should be confirmed by the home university coordinator in order for the student to be qualified to apply for the Hanyang exchange program.

#### **National Health Insurance**

The Korean government is mandating all long-term sojourn foreigners to be registered for the National Health Insurance (NHI) since March 2021. Exchange students will be subject to the registration after applying for the Foreign Registration Card. The monthly amount of the NHI will be **approximately 76,000 KRW** from January 2024. Please be aware that the fees may increase in 2025. Please note that the individual health insurance will be still required, as the NHI will not be valid until the foreign registration card is issued, and it may not cover some unexpected matters related to international students, such as hospitalization and etc. Note those eligible for NHI Registration Exemption can apply for exemption on their own, and further information will be shared later.

#### **Korean Language Course**

There are two types of Korean Language Courses available for exchange/visiting students at Hanyang University ERICA. The Survival Korean course is provided by the Institute of International Education (IIE) exclusively for exchange/visiting students, with the tuition fee fully covered by the Office of International Affairs (OIA). The Intensive Korean course is open to all students, not just exchange/visiting students, and requires payment of the tuition fee. Please refer to the table below for more details.

Students must be aware that it may be very difficult to register for some courses and their preferred choices of courses are <b>NOT GUARANTEED</b> . We ask exchange students to be flexible with their course preferences. If students have any essential courses required for graduation, we suggest them to take it at their home university.

# Submission Instructions (Documents #6, #7)

- The **Original copy of verified certificate of enrollment** and **Financial Affidavit form** with the proof documents need to be submitted by post to the address below by November 15<sup>th</sup>, 23:59 KST (Friday):

- **Electronic (scanned) copies of the documents** need to be uploaded in the Online application system. (Document #6 in the Financial affidavit box, #7 in the Home University Certificate of Enrollment box)

# 5. Academic Information —

## **English Courses**

We offer around 500~600 courses in English (Major: 70%, Elective: 30%) per year over various departments. Exchange students are allowed to take courses from different departments **upon availability.** The most up-to-date course list becomes available a month prior to the beginning of semester. Until then, students should refer to the previous year's course list. (e.g. **2025 Spring semester** applicant should refer to **2024 Spring semester** course list). But note course list may differ every year. The previous English-taught course list (<a href="https://bit.ly/4e2WuP3">https://bit.ly/4e2WuP3</a>) can be found as linked.

\*We accept graduate students, but they are highly required to take undergraduate level ( $3^{rd} - 4^{th}$  year) courses, and the number of graduate courses to take can be highly limited.

## **Credits and Study Load**

1 Hanyang University (HYU) credit consists of 15 contact hours. In most cases, the conversion to ECTS (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System) is "1 Hanyang credit equals 2 ECTS." A regular student's study load at Hanyang typically ranges from 15 to 18 credits per semester, with a maximum of 20 credits. Exchange students must enroll in at least two regular courses to maintain their visa status.

# **Course Registration**

Before coming to Korea, students will have a chance to register courses online. There are different phases for course registration categorized by their major & year and it works on "first-come, first-served" basis. The specific dates will be sent to students directly through email and uploaded to our website: <u>Academic Calendar</u> (as of 2024)

#### **Evaluation and Grade**

Although the evaluation method may differ based on professor's policy, attendance is always an essential part of the evaluation process. Hanyang does not have re-sit examinations so the final grade inputted into the system cannot be changed. Students can take only one P/F course in one semester and most courses will be in letter grade. Please refer to the below chart for the grade system at Hanyang.

# 6. Campus Life

#### Housing

Students can apply for on-campus dormitories approximately two months before the semester begins. Please note that dormitory placement is not automatically guaranteed for all applying students. To secure accommodation in the on-campus dormitories, students must apply during the designated dormitory application period. Housing information is available on the <u>website</u> (only in Korean).

On-campus dormitory placement will NOT be guaranteed if students <u>fail to complete the housing application or submit the housing fee payment by the deadline.</u>

# **Buddy Program**

Buddies are current Hanyang students who volunteer to support new students for their smooth settlement and adjustment into the life and culture in Korea. Representing Korea as a cultural delegation, buddies will interact with new exchange/visiting students throughout the semester and provide them assistance in various areas.
