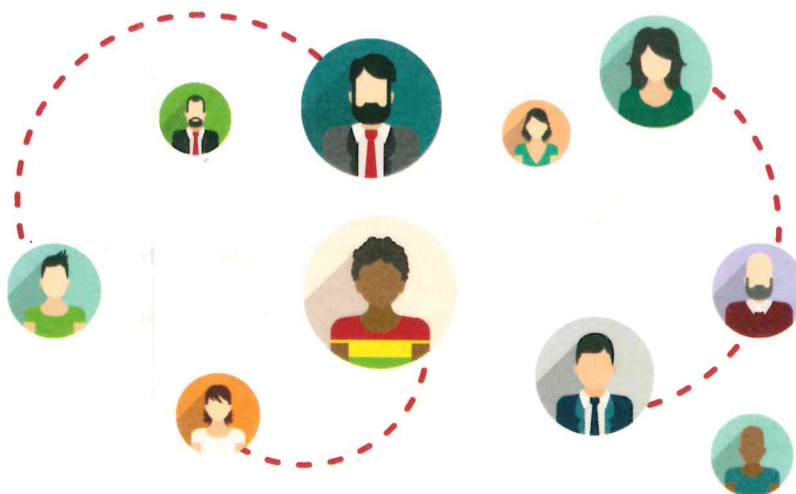


Each culture a centre

We have many centres for specialized studies: Berber Studies, Canadian Studies, Jewish Studies, Post-colonial and Gender Studies, on Buddhism, on Contemporary Africa, on Contemporary Europe, on Food and Nutrition, on Gender History, on Latin America, on Mediterranean Cultures, the Center for Matteo Ripa and the Chinese College, the I-LanD Research Centre, the Inter-University Centre "LelLaIE" on lexicography, etc.

There are also the **Confucius Institute**, the **"Russkij Mir"** Centre for Russian Language and Culture, and the **"Umberto Scerrato" Oriental Museum**.

Finally, the **School for Higher Education in Procida** hosts workshops and summer schools.



An Institution that follows everybody ... anywhere

Our students are followed **from their enrolment to their first steps in their working life** through a dedicated office, the **S.Or.T. (Service for Orientation and Tutoring)** that supports them throughout their university careers, and into their first experiences in the labour market, helping them to clarify and solve the various problems that may arise.

There is also an **Orientation Office for Students with Disabilities (S.O.D.)**, that provides initial help on entry as well as continued assistance with all aspects of university life.

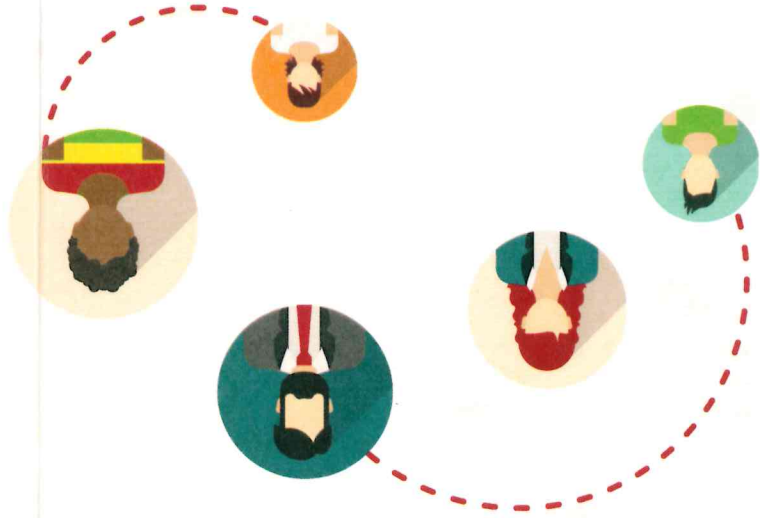
For almost three centuries

Created in 1732, it is the oldest School of Chinese and Oriental studies on the European continent, with a strong tradition in the study of the languages, cultures and societies of Asia, Africa, America and Europe. From its very beginning "L'Oriental" aimed at being a study and research centre that highlighted both differences and similarities between cultures. Today its courses are offered by its three Departments: Asia, Africa and the Mediterranean, Human and Social Sciences, and Literary, Linguistic and Comparative Studies. More than 40 languages and cultures are taught, several courses are also in e-learning. Italian as L2 is taught for foreign students. Migrants that have been granted refugee status do not pay enrolment fees.

Everywhere in the world

Lots of opportunities for **studying, doing research, and working abroad** through ca. **500 Erasmus+ and international agreements** with universities all over the world, for joint scientific projects, for exchanging publications and other materials, for teacher, researcher and student mobility, for organizing meetings, seminars and cultural events. From Europe to Africa, from America to Asia and Oceania.

More than 1000 internship and training agreements both in Italy and abroad with public and private institutions such as the Office of the Prime Minister, the Constitutional Court, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Cultural Institutes, Consulates, Libraries, business companies, agencies, etc. Opportunities to take part in land and underwater archaeological fieldwork.



From China to Tanzania

Each year, within the framework of our agreements with Universities in Argentina, Brazil, Canada, Chile, China, India, Indonesia, Japan, Nigeria, the Russian Federation, Tanzania, Vietnam, and other countries, our University issues announcements of scholarship opportunities for students who want to stay in other countries for up to one year, for improving their knowledge of the local language, and/or for taking courses and exams in our partner institutions.
